-to have the sum of \$50.00 out of the money owing the testatrix out of the estate of the testatrix's father

2. Hester A. Moore --daughter

-to have 1 bed and furn., ½ dozen Windsor chairs, 1 red table, 1 ---, 2 ½ dozen plates, 1 linen wheel, 1 dozen spoons, 2 pair of cards

3. Aurelia Patience Marvel --daughter of Collins W. Marvel

-the bed, bedstead and furn., which the testatrix hired out to the said Collins, to his daughter Aurelia and also to have 1 safe cupboard

4. Mary E. Marvel --daughter

-the rest and remainder of the estate to be divided among the testatrix's above named daughters

5. Jesse A. D. Bradley

-to have the residue and remainder of the estate not already given
