

Folio 169 **NANCY PRETTYMAN, of Indian River Hundred** 07/16/1855 09/15/1863

Bequeaths to:

1. Charlotty Burton --sister
-to have the sum of \$30.00
2. Sarah Burton --sister
-to have the sum of \$30.00
3. John Prettyman
-to have 6 acres of land lying on the southward side of the road
-named executor of the will
4. Alfred B. Prettyman --son of John Prettyman
-to have all the lands the testatrix' dies possessed of except for the above 6 acres
-to have all the residue of the estate

Witnesses: M. B. Marvel
 Dagworthy Derickson

Then came: M. B. Marvel

Note: the testatrix signed the will in her own hand

Note: letters of administration were granted to Alfred B. Prettyman who gave bond with John Prettyman, security in the sum of \$400.00

Folio 171 **MARGARET H. WILSON** 07/27/1859 09/22/1863

"being of a Sound mind and memory . . ."

Bequeaths to:

1. Robert Houston --brother
-to have all the sums of money that he may be owing to the testatrix at the time of her death
2. Dr. Robert H. Griffith
John W. Houston --brother
-to them and the survivor of them in trust all the lands the testatrix holds and all sums loaned and the interest for the use of the testatrix's sister
-John to have Negro girl "Mary" to serve him until she arrives at the age of 25 and then to be free and she to receive from the estate the sum of \$100.00
-remainder of the estate to be divided among the testatrix's brothers Robert, John and David and sister Elizabeth to be divided equally among them
-John named executor of the will
3. Elizabeth W. Dunning --sister (widow of Henry Dunning)
-to have the land and money held in trust for her by the testatrix's brother and Dr. Robert Griffith
4. John H. Dunning --nephew
William Dunning --nephew
Edwin Dunning --nephew
Clara E. G. Dunning --niece
-at the death of their mother to have all the estate left her during her widowhood to be divided among them equally and should either of them die, then that share to be divided among the survivors
5. Dr. David H. Houston --brother
-to have all that land in Delaware for the term of 99 years being the land which the testatrix purchased from her said brother by deed dated the 27th of July 1859 and to have for that term if he lives that long and to be held in trust for the benefit of any child he may now have and should any and all issue of his die without lawful issue, then the aforesaid land to fall to the testatrix's brothers Robert and John W. Houston and sister Elizabeth Dunning and to be divided among them share and share alike
