2. William Huffington Ellingsworth (son of George Ellingsworth)
 -to have all the goods and chattels which the testatrix holds by bill of sale given by
 J. H. Moore, constable dated the 27th of December 1844 consisting of 1 cow and calf,
 2 shoats, 1 loom and tackle, 1 bed and furn., 1 table, 6 flag-bottom chairs, 1 safe
 cupboard, 1 new bedstead and 1 set of axes and hoes and also of the property the
 testatrix has in her house, 1 walnut desk, 1 walnut table, 2 of the testatrix's best bed
 quilts, 2 of the best sheets, and also 2 of the best pillows--and Mary Hill to keep the
 above items until William comes to age 21 and then to give him the estate
3. Mary Susan Marvel --child of William and Catherine Marvel
 -should William Huffington Ellingsworth die w/out issue before coming of age, then
 to have the items left him and also to have 1 bed and furn.
4. Children of William and Catherine Marvel
 -remainder of the estate to be divided among Mary R. Hill, William H. Ellingsworth
 and the children of William and Catherine Marvel
 -also Mary R. Hill, William H. Ellingsworth and the children of William & Catherine
 Marvel to have the testatrix's house and lot being No. #45 in the town of Seaford
 adjoining the lots of George Hellen, Jacob Wright and others and which lies on
 North Street--and each of them to have one third part with the children of William &
 Catherine to share one third part.
