NATHANIEL HEARN, of the Town of Laurel 10/09/1868 11/26/1869

"being of Sound and disposing mind and memory . . ."

Bequeaths to:

1. Daniel Hearn --son

-to have a lot or piece or parcel of land lying on Front Street in the Town of Laurel it being all the land that he has enclosed where he now lives and also a certain lot or piece of land lying in the aforesaid town and lying on each side of the Delaware Rail Road called the Penitentiary Lot bounded on the east by a fence and running along by the west end of a smoke house and a lot or piece of ground lying on Corn and Market Streets adjoining the land of Benjamin Shipp and David R. Wolfe and also to have the sum of \$500.00

2. Maria J. Bacon --daughter (now the wife of Joseph Bacon)

-to have a tract or piece of land lying in Little Creek Hundred lying on the south side of the main run of a branch adjoining the lands of Thomas S. Cannon, Alfred Adams, William W. Dashiell and the said Joseph Bacon, cont. 120 acres and also to have a tract, piece or parcel of land adjoining the lands of Andrew J. Horsey, Joshua H. Marvel and others cont. 50 acres of land and also to have a piece or parcel of land lying on Front Street in the Town of Laurel adjoining the lands of Sally Fooks and Edward Taylor and also a piece or parcel of land on Corn Street in the Town of Laurel adjoining the lands of John Crockett, William W. Dashiell, and others and also a piece or parcel of land adjoining the lands of John T. Moore and William Wheatley in the Town of Laurel and also to have 30 shares of the Delaware Railroad stock and \$2000.00 in money to be paid to her in part by 2 notes the testator holds against her husband amounting to \$1250.00 and the remainder to be paid to her in cash all the above to her and her children and should her children all die before arriving at the age of 21, then the property shall descend to her brother and sisters in equal shares

3. Henry C. Hearn --son

-to have a tract or parcel of land lying in Broad Creek Hundred adjoining to the lands of William S. Moore, Josiah Moore and John Moore and George W. Horsey cont. 240 acres of land and also to have a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the Town of Laurel on Oat Street adjoining to the land of William S. Callaway and 2 lots that the testator devised to the testator's son Daniel Hearn and also a lot or piece of land lying in the Town of Laurel bounded on the north side by Broad Creek and on the west by Wheat Street and on the south by Front Street all to the said Henry and his heirs forever -remainder and residue of the estate to be divided among the testator's youngest children, being Maria, Henry, Martha and Harriet
