-to have all of the testator's personal estate to manage and dispose of according to her ability and as she shall deem best for the advantage of herself and the children and to pay the testator's debts and expenses
-to have all the testator's real estate during her natural life and she is empowered to sell and dispose of the land the testator owns in Dagsborough Hundred and the lot the testator owns in Georgetown on Bedford Street adjoining the lots of George W. Willin or to dispose of the said farm either or both for her own interest and the interest of her children
-named executrix of the will
2. Frank Pepper --son
-at the death of the testator's widow to have the home farm whereon the testator now lives cont. 222 1/2 acres as appears by the plot of the land now among the testator's papers and on condition
3. Letitia Pepper --daughter (youngest daughter)
-testator's son Frank to pay her the sum of \$100.00 which the testator makes as a charge on the land given him
-at the death of the testator's widow to have the farm called the "Billy Marvel Farm"
4. Willard Pepper --son
-at the death of the testator's widow to have all the land lying on the south side of the county road leading from the testator's residence through and by the residence of James Martin and within the following bounds all on the west side of the road leading from the said Martin's to the Prettyman Road to the intersection of the big ditch and the lands of Harrison Messick and thence . . . to the lands of Josiah P Marvel, of Isaac Short and James Martin to the beginning and to have on condition
