3 February 1791

To sons Henry Hastings and Melvin Hastings - all lands. Henry's is to have the part where he now lives and Melvin to have the part where he and I now live. Also orchards, sheep and hogs and all my meat, fat, corn, flax, peas, bran, potatoes, wool "and whatever else it pleasth God that the Earth produceth"

To son Henry - the bay mare that he now has

To son Melvin - my old breeding mare and my black mare and her colt

To grandchild Severn - my youngest colt named Pink, my bed and furniture, my big chest and all the things in my house. All to be in the care of his father until my grandson is of age
