-to have the testator's best bed and furn.

3. Henry Draper --son

-testator's sons Thomas and Miers to pay him the sum of \$1000.00

-to have the 2nd best bed and furn.

-remainder of the personal estate to be divided between Henry and testator's daughter

4. Josephine Draper --granddaughter

-testator's sons Thomas and Miers to pay her the sum of \$200.00

5. James W. Draper

-testator's sons Thomas and Miers to pay him the sum of \$500.00

1. Mary R. Knowles --wife

-to have for her natural life all that tract of land lying and being in Nanticoke Hundred called "Perkins's Farm" adjoining the lands of Josiah Marvel, Thomas Wilkins, and also adjoining to the farm where the testator now resides and the tract of land hereafter devised to the testator's daughter Eliza Jane James cont. 285 acres and valued by the testator at the sum of \$3420.00

-to have for her natural life and no longer the sum of \$400.00 to be paid to her within
