To sons Hardy Callaway, John Callaway, Tubman Callaway - residue of personal estate and my land

17 July 1790

To wife Annis Kinney - all lands for her natural life

To son Samuel Kinney - lands after wife's death

To my son John Kinney - one shilling

To daughters Sarah Kinney, Elizabeth Kinney, and Mary Kinney - all my movable estate, goods and chattels

Thomas Prittyman

26 February 1790

To wife Elizabeth and son William - the plantation where I now dwell

To son George Prittyman - half of the land on the north side of a branch called Tusseca Branch to be laid off convenient to his plantation

To son Burton Prittyman - the other half of said land situated on the north side of Tusseca Branch and all the movables that he now has

To son Robert Prittyman - a parcel of land on the north side of Horse Pounds Branch being half a tract called Hog Quarter

To son Thomas Prittyman - one shilling

To daughter Comfort Roggers - other part of Hog Quarter on the south side of the branch

To daughters Ann Morris, Mary Ingram, Patience, Nolds and Tabitha Morris - each one shilling

To daughter Sary Marvel - the goods and movables that she already has

To daughter Agness Williams - feather bed and furniture, chest and spinning wheel

To daughter Ezebel Pepper - movables that she already has
