4 May 1789

"I give my Children all a charge to live Brotherly and Sisterly together and for rest of my affairs I desire in this manner. As for the Negroes as I have plased them. I give to my daughter Easter Thorogood, One Heifer and one pair of silver Buckles and no more. I give to my daughter Marget Ingram One gold Ring and no more. I give to my Sun in law Robert Hood one Bible and to my daughter Mary Hood or Marget Hood one pair of Silver Buckles. And for all my Wearing Apparel to be equally divided among my three daughters and Saddle to give how he thinks fit and one turtle shell ring likewise and for Sun William to get a Sames Book and Hims Book a pease for my three daughters and all the rest of my amoveables Estate to my Son William Newbold"

7 May 1789 Then came Thomas Jones and Wingate Jones who swore that the contents of the within writing was declared in their presence and pronounced by Margaret Newbold to be her Will. She being then at her own dwelling house and sick of the sickness whereof she died

"The last Will of Sarah Turlington late of Virginia but Last of Sussex County Spinster dec. pronounced by her word of Mouth in the presence of us the Subscribers, she being then at her usual place of abode and sick of the sickness whereof she died which words so spoken were as follows, I leave all my Estate to Benjamin Warrington, except two petticoats to my eldest Sister in law and in case of her death to my next Sister in Law. Which words were spoken by the said dec. on the 31st day of March 1789. In Witness whereof We have hereto set out hands the Twenty Second day of May 1789"

22 May 1789 Then came Thomas Marvel and Phillip Marvel who swore that the words so spoken were this day committed to writing

To son __ (?Edward) Short - 60 acres of land being a warrant called Shorts Beginning

To son John Short - the plantation bought of Rolon Bevins with the land belonging in the neck. Also the improvements bought of John Short

To Purnell Short - the land whereon I now live being 80 acres patented by the name Last Of All. Also my third part of sawmill

To wife Betty - possession of the 80 acres and movable estate to support her and her children during her widowhood

To son Phillip Short - Negro girl named Leah

To "son Phillip and daughters Polly, Lewa, Betse, Edward, John and Purnell Short" - movable estate after wife's widowhood

Executor: son Edward
